To provide you with an anonymous, easy, secure and responsible way to properly dispose of these drugs, the Adams County Sheriff's Office, Adams Police Department, Rome Police Department and Wisconsin Dells Police Department have established permanent pharmaceutical drug drop-off boxes for all Adams County Residents.

Drop-Off Procedures

When turning in your medicine please:

1. **PLEASE** place pills into a zip-top baggie before depositing.
2. Bring the medications to the secured drug collection box.
3. Drop medications into the drop box.

Why turn in your
expired, unwanted
& unused

- Protect children and animals from harm. They may find and swallow medications thrown in the trash.
- Stop people from scavenging and selling medications illegally.
- Flushing medication down the toilet or sink drain is NOT acceptable. Doing so hurts the environment and releases toxins into drinking water & soil.
- Burning medications is NOT acceptable. It releases harmful toxins into the air.
