When turning in your medicine please:

- 1. **PLEASE** place pills into a ziptop baggie before depositing.
- 2. Bring the medications to the secured drug collection box.
- 3. Drop medications into the drop box.

- Burning medications is NOT acceptable. It releases harmful toxins into the air.
